Students will take the following 2 courses.

▪ **Methods and Materials in Arts and Crafts**

Students will develop maximum skill levels in arts and crafts projects. Explore recreational values in different programs, different techniques necessary for proper presentation of arts and crafts programs to groups of disparate ages and physical abilities; and learn various methods of teaching the developed skills to special groups.

▪ **Therapeutic Recreation for Individuals with Disabilities**

Philosophy and history of therapeutic recreation will be explored. An emphasis on the therapeutic recreation process and providing services based on clients’ needs. Students learn how to adapt activities to meet the needs, interests and abilities of individuals with specific disabilities.
